# **Living and Non-Living**

### Let's Begin 🔊 🎶

Go to your school ground and look around you. Pick out two things that you think are living and two that you think are non-living.

We see many things around us. Some are **living**. People, animals and plants are all different kinds of **living things**.

Some things are **non-living**. Houses, cars, rocks and water are examples of **non-living things**.

Some non-living things are made by humans (human-made). Houses and cars are examples of things made by humans.

Some non-living things are found in nature. Rocks and water are **natural things**. They are not made by us.

Living things differ from non-living things in several ways.

Living things need air, water and food. They breathe, grow and move.

Non-living things do not need food, water and air. They do not breathe. They cannot grow or move on their own.

Let us learn more about living things.

#### LIVING THINGS BREATHE

Living things breathe. They cannot live without air.

Humans and animals like elephants, cows, monkeys and tigers breathe with the help of their lungs.

Look at a sleeping dog. See its chest rise and fall. This tells us it is breathing.

Fish breathe through **gills**. Insects breathe through holes on their bodies.

Plants also breathe. They breathe through tiny holes on their leaves.

Non-living things do not breathe.

#### LIVING THINGS EAT

All living things need food to live. Plants make their own food using sunlight, water and air. Animals eat plants and other animals.

Non-living things do not eat. They do not need food.

#### LIVING THINGS FEEL

Human beings and animals can feel heat, cold and pain. They can see, hear, smell and taste things. Plants feel the sunlight falling on them. Non-living things cannot feel.



#### LIVING THINGS MOVE

Humans move from place to place. Animals move from place to place in search of food, water and shelter. They also move to protect themselves.

Plants do not move from place to place. The *Mimosa* or touch-me-not plant closes its leaves when touched. Plants grow towards sunlight. Non-living things do not move on their own.

#### LIVING THINGS GROW

Have you seen pictures of yourself when you were a baby? Do you look the same? No, you have become bigger or grown up. A kitten grows into a cat. A puppy grows into a dog. A sapling grows into a big tree. Living things grow. But non-living things do not grow.



#### LIVING THINGS REPRODUCE

Living things reproduce. Humans give birth to babies. Animals give birth to baby animals. Birds lay eggs that hatch into baby birds. Many plants reproduce through seeds. Non-living things do not reproduce.
