ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

“Excellence in academics is the hallmark of any good institution”.

Securing **100% results** in Secondary and Senior Secondary Examinations itself is a true reflection of the diligence and sincere efforts of our students. In both Std XII and X Board Examinations, SBIOA Senior Secondary School has made a striking performance by producing 100% result and centums.

AISSCE – STD. XII BOARD EXAMINATION:

A total of **34** students appeared for the examination and achieved commendable results, including **one centum** in **Tamil**. **Aravind G M** topped the school with **476/500** marks, followed by **Deepti V** with **448** marks securing **second** place, and **Harshitha P** with **447** marks securing **third place**.

AISSE – STD. X BOARD EXAMINATION:

In Std. X, **75** students appeared for the examination. **Avanthika A T** emerged as the **school topper** with **486/500** marks, followed by **Sarvesh Kumaar S K** with **485/500** marks securing second place. **Jose Abhinauv J** secured the third place with a score of **478/500**.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

Pre-KG was introduced during this academic year with an initial strength of 16 students, and **Braindemics** methods of teaching were implemented to strengthen early learning skills. For Classes I to V, the **Karadipath** method of teaching was introduced to reinforce foundational learning.

To enhance academic competence and competitive skills, students participated in various examinations conducted separately, including **Spell Bee, Bebras, SAFAL, IFSE (Mathematics & English), VVM Science Talent Examination**, and Olympiads in **English, Mathematics, Science, General Knowledge, Reasoning, and Aptitude**.

Quizzociates classes were conducted on every second and fourth Saturday by subject experts to enhance students' knowledge, critical thinking, and quiz skills.

The Orientation Meeting was held with active participation from parents, where school rules and guidelines were explained.

ECA Clubs commenced from July 4, organized into ECA-A and ECA-B, conducted on Tuesdays and Thursdays respectively.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Newly designed and innovative KG classrooms with attractive cartoon paintings were introduced, and the entire school campus was fully painted, creating a vibrant and welcoming learning environment. Essential infrastructure upgrades such as RO drinking water facilities and a generator were provided to ensure safety and uninterrupted functioning. The basketball ground was newly painted, and the computer laboratory was upgraded with three air conditioners. The staff room was furnished with new furniture and air conditioning, along with locker cupboards for staff use. Classrooms were equipped with bookshelves, and new interactive panel boards were installed to enhance teaching and learning. A well-maintained, full-fledged garden was developed, and a new entrance arch with a name board was erected. To support student welfare, a full-time canteen facility was introduced. Additionally, a new exit area and a dedicated waiting area for parents were constructed for better safety and convenience.

ACADEMICS & CULTURAL ACHIEVEMENT OF STUDENTS

Our students have excelled in various fields, showcasing talent, creativity, and academic excellence during the academic year 2025–2026:

- Art Recognition: A drawing by A. Rithik Esvar (Class X-A) was published in Daily Thanthi on 9th June 2025.
- Music: Saanvi of Class V-A had the remarkable opportunity to sing with legendary singer Shankar Mahadevan at the Parampara 2025 concert in Mumbai.
- Young Scientist Contest (25th July 2025): Held at MIET College in collaboration with News 7 Channel, students presented innovative projects in Environmental Science, Robotics, Renewable Energy, and Health Technology. Syed Al Rayan and Mohammed Aaqil of Class X won Second Prize for their project.
- IIT Madras Certificate Course Recognition: 26 students from Grades XI and XII were awarded certificates for completing the course. Mr. A. Vinoth Kumar was recognized for his exceptional coordination and service.
- Sustainable Development Project: Our team secured Second Prize along with a cash award of ₹4,000 for their outstanding work.
- Aakash Talent Test (31st August 2025): Prasheitha S. of Grade XII-B scored full marks and was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation and 100% ACE Scholarship on 8th October 2025.
- Vigilance Awareness Week Quiz (14th October 2025): Union Bank of India organized an interschool quiz, in which B. S. Anirudh Velva and S. Santhosh secured Third Prize.

NCC

The NCC Air Wing Unit – JD/JW was approved at SBIOA School, providing students opportunities for discipline, leadership, and national service. 49 students participated in the First-Year Selection Trials, and 25 cadets (15 boys, 10 girls) were selected. C/T Surya M was chosen for the NCC Directorate Selection Board Interview in Chennai.

School cadets also participated in the NCC 22 Firing Practice Collection Trials, with M. Kishor (IX B) and B.V. Nithesh (IX B) selected for the next level. The Rockford Group secured 4th position overall. These activities enhanced cadets' skills, discipline, confidence, and competitive spirit.

AWARDS & ACCOLADES

- ✓ Mr. A. Vinoth Kumar and Mr. Nigil William Freeman were honoured with the **Best Mentor Award** for their guidance and support to students.
- ✓ Mr. John Immanuel secured **Second Prize** in the debate conducted during the **Teacher's Day Competitions** organized by **SHARPEN Academy** on 30th August and received a shield and a cash prize of ₹2,000.
- ✓ Mrs. P. Chellabharathi was awarded the **Best Teacher Award (2025–26)**.
- ✓ Dr. R. Murali Shankar (Music & Hindi) was honoured as the **Ambassador of Thirukkural 2025** and conferred with the **Manidham Vidhaipom Award 2025**.

SOCIAL AWARENESS PROGRAMME

World Environment Day was observed on 5th June 2025 to promote environmental awareness and reduce plastic usage. Students carried *Manja Pai* (cloth bags) and participated in a rally with awareness slogans. KG students took part in a seed-sowing activity using paper cups, learning the importance of caring for nature.

The school broadcasting system was revived as “Thulir Panbalai – 90.7.” An RJ audition was conducted, and selected students received professional training from an All India Radio announcer, enhancing communication and social awareness skills.

SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS FOR TEACHERS

The school conducted several seminars and workshops to enhance teachers' professional skills. In June, sessions included Mrs. Raja Uma Rani's experience sharing, a Kaaval Uthavi app safety program, a Karadipath demo class, and online English training by Burlington. In July, teachers attended the "Smile with Grammar" orientation and the 7th Conference on Computational Thinking in Schools (CTiS 2025) online. September included a Capacity Building Program for Senior Secondary Physics teachers, a Primary Spelling webinar, a Jolly Phonics session, and a Karadipath workshop. In October, a two-day Teachers' Training in Chennai focused on classroom observation and English pronunciation. November featured a webinar on Two Board Exams as per NEP and a session on website updates by Sharpen Academy. These programmes strengthened pedagogy, classroom management, language skills, safety awareness, and technology integration.

SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS

In 2025–2026, the school conducted various seminars and workshops to create awareness and guide students. Students took a pledge against drug addiction, attended a Child Abuse Safety session by Childline 1098, and watched the National Award-winning short film "*Chalo Jeete Hain*" under the Prerana initiative to promote values. Youth Awakening Day on 16th October inspired curiosity and determination through Dr. Karthickeyan's address. A Career Guidance Session for Classes 11 and 12, conducted by Dr. Jayaprakash Gandhi, provided insights into higher education and future career pathways. These programmes fostered awareness, responsibility, values, and career planning among students.

AWARENESS PROGRAMME

The school organized several health and safety awareness activities for students and staff to promote well-being:

- ✓ **In June**, a **Blood Donation Camp** was conducted by SBI, in which **40 donors registered**, **20 were found eligible**, and **20 were rejected**.
- ✓ **In July**, an **Eye Camp** was conducted for **Classes VI–XII and staff**, screening **486 students**; **316 were found normal**, **40 were prescribed new glasses**, **83**

had existing glasses, 7 required a change of glasses, and 40 were referred for further treatment.

- ✓ **In October**, a **Dental Camp** was organized for **Classes IV–XII**, during which **700 students** were examined and advised on oral hygiene. In the same month, a **Fire Safety Demonstration** conducted by the **Airport Authority of India** trained students in fire handling, use of extinguishers, evacuation procedures, and first aid.
- ✓ **In November**, a **Vaccination Camp** was conducted for **Classes I, V, and X**, vaccinating **102 students**, and the **Health & Wellness Club** conducted a **Hygiene Awareness session** for toddlers.

INNOVATIVE ASSEMBLY

Theme-based, level-wise assemblies were conducted throughout the week. **Marvellous Mondays** featured the General Assembly, while **Thoughtful Tuesdays** focused on attentive listening through music sessions. On **Wonderful Wednesdays**, topics were assigned and each level performed activities based on themes such as *A Day Without Toys and Gadgets, Sharing Makes Us Happy, A World Without Money, Can AI Be Ethical, Save Trees Save Earth, Safety First, Respecting Elders, Breaking Stereotypes, My Family, Magic Words, Kindness to Animals, Importance of Cleanliness, Honesty is the Best Policy, and Cyber Safety for Students*. **Thriving Thursdays** were dedicated to completing pending academic work, and **Fervid Fridays** featured house-wise assemblies, with points awarded to all houses for discipline and active participation during the assembly. A special assembly program was conducted as an inaugural ceremony for school houses namely **Cheran House, Cholan House, Pandian House and Pallavan House**. **Prabakaran K**, Teacher in Economics hosted the program.

- ✓ July witnessed the Investiture Ceremony, fostering leadership qualities among students. Kamarajar Day was celebrated in the Kindergarten section in the presence of the Chief Guest Mrs. N. Saththamai Priya.
- ✓ August was marked by patriotic fervour with the celebration of the 79th Independence Day, graced by the Chief Guest Mrs. Pauline Preetha Jeba Selvi, Assistant Professor, Bishop Heber College. Students also visited Ibrahim Farms on an educational trip, and the school participated in the SBI Foundation Diamond Jubilee Celebration.
- ✓ September focused on honouring teachers through Teachers' Day celebrations. The formal function was graced by the Chief Guest Mr. Mani Prahasthathi, during which Mrs. P. Chellabharathi received the Best Teacher Award (2025–26). Staff enrichment and bonding activities were also organized.
- ✓ October highlighted cultural values through Diwali celebrations organized by Cholan House, along with students' active participation in the Viksit Bharat 2047 Competitions.
- ✓ November featured strong patriotic and value-based activities. Students participated in the Mass Rendition of "Vande Mataram" led by Mr. Balak Ram Negi, Divisional Regional Manager, Tiruchi. Children's Day was celebrated with

Chief Guest Mr. D. Mohanraj, along with International Men's Day, the Seed and Traditional Food Festival, and Thanksgiving activities.

KG ACTIVITIES

During the academic year 2025–2026, the Kindergarten Department conducted various activity-based programmes to support joyful learning and holistic development.

- ✓ Key activities included Balloon Day, Red Day, Yellow Day, Green Day, and Blue Day, promoting colour recognition, creativity, and participation. KG students conducted level and theme-based assemblies and took part in celebrations such as Vijayadashami with a Golu display.
- ✓ Educational exposure was provided through field trips to Classic Bakery and Ibrahim Farms, along with a Campus Tour to familiarize children with the school environment. Skill-based activities such as Gardening Day and the Pre-KG Kiddos' Fest encouraged creativity, confidence, and parent involvement.
- ✓ Children's Day was celebrated with special programmes presented by teachers. Overall, the activities effectively enhanced social, emotional, and experiential learning among Kindergarten students.

INNOVATIVE INITIATIVES

- ✓ FM Radio training was introduced for selected RJ students, and the **Thulir FM Group** was formed.
- ✓ Slow learners were identified from the primary level, and remedial classes were conducted regularly.
- ✓ A **Help Desk** was established to clarify students' academic doubts.
- ✓ Daily and weekly tests were conducted to ensure continuous assessment.
- ✓ **Dance, Keyboard, and School Band** classes were introduced for holistic development.
- ✓ **Staff Circle Time, potluck gatherings, field trips, demo classes, and peer observations** were organised to promote professional growth and collaboration.
- ✓ Measures were taken to reduce the weight of students' school bags.
- ✓ A **Foster Committee** was formed, with teachers of Classes X and XII assigned two late bloomers each for focused guidance and support.
- ✓ A special 7:30 AM class is conducted to support the late bloomers of Classes X and XII.

EDUCATIONAL VISITS & CO-CURRICULAR PARTICIPATION

- ✓ On **18th September 2025**, the staff visited **Ibrahim Farms, Narthamalai**, enjoying an educational experience observing animals, reptiles, and birds.
- ✓ **Thirteen Scout students** attended the **Rajyapuraskar Test Camp** at St. Antony's Higher Secondary School, Nanjampatti, showcasing their scouting skills and co-curricular participation.
