- The cadets were introduced to the Virus SW 80 microlight aircraft used for NCC flying training. The special features, flight controls, cockpit instruments, safety systems, and its role in providing basic aviation exposure were explained.
- The cadets witnessed aircraft take-off and landing procedures and observed a spectacular aerial demonstration by three Su-30MKI aircraft including formation flying, coordinated manoeuvres, and explanations on advanced flying techniques, navigation systems, and autopilot functions.
- The visit provided valuable practical knowledge of military aviation and inspired the cadets to pursue careers in the Armed Forces and aviation sector.

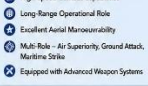
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NCC CADETS ENROLLMENT SELECTION TRIAL 2026 - 2028
